

### **Port Edwards School District December Updates**

Happy Holidays! On behalf of the staff at the Port Edwards School District, we would like to wish our students, families and community members an enjoyable and peaceful holiday season. The first three months of the school year have moved by very rapidly; we hope that the upcoming holiday break will provide everyone an opportunity to rest and recharge as we look forward to 2023.

### **Wisconsin DPI Report Cards**

On November 15, the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction released its annual public school report cards. These report cards reflect data collected during the previous (2021-22) school year. According to the DPI, Wisconsin Report Cards "include data on multiple indicators for multiple years across four priority areas: achievement, growth, target group outcomes, and on-track to graduation." A listing of Port Edwards (and all Wisconsin) school district report cards can be found at: https://dpi.wi.gov/accountability/report-cards.

Port Edwards Public Schools receive 4 separate report cards: one each for the district, high school, middle school, and elementary school. Both the DPI and state CESA agencies remind schools and communities that the report cards are not an all-encompassing picture of district effectiveness: they show a moment in time on state testing. A more accurate picture will be taken by looking at a series of years' worth of report cards: this will provide a more comprehensive picture of academic progress in the district.

Now that the district has this annual data, how can it best be utilized? The school district administrative team will study trends in the report card data, and prioritize areas for improvement. We will then create an action plan that identifies reasons for the rating that was earned, and create and put into place steps for improvement in our educational practices.

#### **Inclement Weather: School Delays and Closing**

As we all know, winter weather in Wisconsin brings snowmobiling, skiing, and several other enjoyable outdoor activities. It unfortunately can also bring with it dangerously cold temperatures and hazardous road conditions. Student safety is a priority in Wisconsin Public School Districts: when weather or road conditions are considered to be too hazardous for our students to travel in, school will be delayed or canceled. Please see the "Port Edwards School District Closure and Delay Guidelines" in this month's Blackhawk Bulletin for more information describing under what conditions school is delayed or canceled. and how families are contacted when this occurs.

### Port Edwards Football Wrap Up Successful Season

After making its first playoff appearance since 2019, the Port Edwards Football Team's success was well-noted by the rest of the Central Wisconsin Conference. Ten Port members earned 14 different awards for the 2022 season.

Port was led on the honors list by senior Tim Tranel, who was a first team selection as a Quarterback on offense and Linebacker on Defense. Aside from his defensive honor, he was also selected as the Defensive Player of the Year.

Tranel passed for 1,355 yards, passing for 21 touchdowns with just five interceptions, and rushed for 840 yards on 69 attempts, and accounted for 12 touchdowns and converted on three, two-point conversions.

On defense, he was a tackling machine. In nine games played, he had 70 total tackles and 28 assists to finish with 98 total tackles- 30 more than the second closest. He also recorded eight tackles for loss, three sacks, forced two fumbles, recovered a pair of fumbles, and scored a touchdown on one of those recoveries.

Also making the First Team on offense: were lineman Javden Duehlmeier and receiver. Blayke Lecy. Lecy was the Blackhawks leading receiver with 515 yards on 22 receptions and scored nine touchdowns and reeled in six two-point conversions.

On Defense, it was defensive back Brynden Beck, lineman Hayden Hewitt, as well as Tranel. Beck and Hewitt ranked second and third on the team in tackles with Beck notching 53 and Hewitt 51.

Port had four selections to the second team, with the offense and defense each getting two. Nathan Schwantes and Beck landed on offense as a lineman and running back with Lecy and Tyler Martinson getting the nod as defensive back and linebacker.

Beck was Port's second-leading rusher as he had 441 yards on 59 attempts and scored four times. Martinson was Port's fourth-ranked tackler as he had 46 total tackles with 27 solo and 19 assists. He also had two tackles for loss.

The awards continued for Port as they had also got two athletes on the Offensive Honorable Mention list with Bryce Baumgart and Erik Mock as a lineman and wide receiver. Mock was Port's third-ranked receiver in yardage with 273 yards on 14 carries and accounted for five touchdowns and four two-point conversions.

Aside from Tranel's Defensive Player of the Year honors, Port Edwards Head Coach, Max Ayres, was named Coach of the Year.

Congratulations to all student-athletes including the Cross Country and Volleyball teams as well. Good luck to the teams participating in the coming months! We look forward to seeing other teams' success!.

### Four Blackhawks get CWC-South honors.

PORT EDWARDS – The Port Edwards Volleyball Team had four members receive All-Conference honors for their play in the 2022 season with one member on the Second Team and three more receiving Honorable Mention status.

Sophomore, Kate Hewitt was the Blackhawks' top award winner as she was selected to the second team as a Middle Hitter.

Hewitt ranked second on the team in Total Blocks with 23 and was leader in Kills with 152. Seniors, Emily Frizzell and Bella Hanten and junior, Alliyah Ruiz, all made the Honorable Mention as an Outside Hitter, Middle Hitter, and Libero. Hanten led the Blackhawks in total Blocks with 26 and ranked second in Aces and Kills with 28 and 103.

Emily Frizzell finished tied with Hanten in Kills with 103, and was third in Digs with 103, and third in Aces with 26, as well.

Ruiz was the team leader in Digs with 151.

The Blackhawks finished with an 11-12 overall record

I get many questions about viruses going around this time of year. Below is a list of common respiratory viruses and some helpful information for each one. I hope you and your family have a healthy & enjoyable holiday season. - Nurse Katie

Virus Type	Symptoms	Treatment	Additional Information
Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)	Fever, cough, irritability, wheezing, decreased appetite Primarily affects the lungs	Home Care - see below Severe cases may require hospitalization, airway suctioning, and oxygen	Premature Infants, children < 2 underlying heart/ lung issues, immunocompromised most affected  Lives on surfaces for longer than other viruses
Adenovirus	Has the widest range of symptoms including: sore throat, pink eye, cough, diarrhea, bladder inflammation, fatigue (fevers are rare)	Home Care - see below	Can also be transmitted in feces or water (pools)  Those with pre-existing heart or lung problems have an increased risk
Influenza	Affects primarily the respiratory tract - nose/throat/lungs: Non productive cough, severe body aches, chest discomfort, headache, fever  Often exacerbates asthma	Home Care - see below Anti-viral medication is most effective if given within 48 hours of symptom onset Severe cases may need IV fluid, supplemental oxygen or mechanical ventilation	Can lead to severe/life threatening complications  An annual influenza vaccine reduces your chance of getting the flu and prevents severe complications
Rhinovirus	Sore throat, runny nose, body aches, sneezing, ear infections; exacerbates asthma	Home Care - see below	Many people will have 2-3 rhinovirus infections a year

Home Care: Drink plenty of non-caffeinated fluids, rest, alternate Tylenol and Ibuprofen every 3 hours for fever and pain control, cough drops, patience (viruses are expected to last 7-10 days)

When to seek medical care: The ill person has underlying medical conditions or is immunocompromised,, breathing is labored/skin sucks into the ribs when breathing (retractions); severe chest pain, fever is sustained over 102 despite using Tylenol or Ibuprofen, no urine/wet diapers for > 8 hours



## Closures & Delay Guidelines Updated October, 2022


A school closure can occur at any time during the school year due to unpredicted situations (water mains bursting, etc.) or as a result of hazardous weather.

### Winter Weather Delays & Closings

- 2 hour delays: School will be delayed generally 2 hours if the wind chill is predicted to be at − 30 degrees Fahrenheit or colder at 6:30 a.m., but warmer following that time. If a 2-hour delay is called, classes will begin at 10:00 at JEMS/JEHS, and 10:20 at Ed Heuer Elementary.
- Early releases: Students may be released and sent home from school earlier than normal if extremely cold or severe winter weather appears imminent, and early departure is determined to be safer than leaving at normal school dismissal time.
- School cancellation: Normally scheduled school will be canceled if:
- The wind chill is predicted to be at -30 degrees Fahrenheit or colder for the time period from 6:30 8:00 a.m., without any warming.
- Roads are judged to be too dangerous for travel for the day.

### How families will be contacted if a decision is made to close school:

- Whenever school is closed, families that have their phone numbers registered with the Port Edwards School District will receive an alert telephone call via the Infinite Campus message system.
- The school district will make every attempt possible to publicize delays and closings on local radio, television, and social media sites.


