

### Port Edwards Facilities Committee Update

The 2023-24 school year marks the 5th and final year of school district funding from an operational referendum which was passed by Port Edwards taxpayers on April 2, 2019. This \$600,000 annual amount has allowed the Port Edwards School District to maintain educational programming and pay for operational and maintenance expenses, which funding from the state of Wisconsin falls short of paying for.

In order to continue quality operations of our schools, the Port Edwards School District is seeking approval from voters on a second 5-year operational referendum, as part of the April 2024 election ballot. This

referendum would run from the 2024-25 school year through the 2028-29. In addition to operational funds, the District's facilities committee of 25 community and staff members have identified a number of significant building and grounds needs that will require a second, capital referendum question on the April ballot as well. The passing of a capital referendum question would allow our district to perform much-needed major maintenance to Ed Heuer Elementary School (built in 1969) and John Edwards Middle & High School (built in 1932). Some of these upgrades include significant brick and masonry maintenance, safety upgrades, and the updating of heating and cooling systems and their electronic controls.

On Tuesday, August 22, the first meeting of the P.E.S.D. Facilities Committee took place. Community and staff members were given extensive tours of both academic buildings and were shown several areas at both buildings which are in need of upgrade or more modern, functional equipment. The second meeting of the Facilities Committee took place on Monday, September 11. At this meeting, committee members discussed the need for both an operational (daily operations and maintenance) and a capital (large-scale maintenance) referendum.

With the conclusion of our facilities meetings, all Port Edwards School District residents will now have the opportunity to learn more about the referendum questions which will be on the ballot next April. Over the course of the next several months, district residents will receive emails, mailings, and opportunities to meet with school leaders in person to learn about the referendum.

The short-term future of our district will be largely determined by the voice of our voters next April. We are hopeful that our community wants to continue to help make Port Edwards Schools one of the best small districts in the state, with outstanding opportunities for all students! Next, school attendance is a powerful predictor of student outcomes. Students who regularly attend school and graduate from high school build a foundation for more positive life outcomes. Knowing this, please set clear expectations for your child about attendance rules and the consequences of missing school. Teachers, counselors, and administrators may be able to provide additional information that helps determine what is causing a child to miss school. For support, please contact us to start that conversation. Next week attendance records will be reviewed and processed. Please review the attendance policy in the student handbook under Attendance on pg. 8, 9 and 10.

### Notes from the Nurse

Fall is in the air! It is hard to believe that school will have been in session for about a month now. Time flies!

We have started to see an uptick in the amount of illness within our buildings, which is correlating with the change in season and the fact that students are back together in close quarters for a large portion of the day. Did you know that children are 2-3 times more likely than adults to get sick with the flu, and on average, one in three children in the U.S. is affected by the virus each year. Usually, the flu is spread from person to person through coughing and sneezing. Occasionally, people get the flu from touching a germ-infested surface.

It is important to know the difference between cold and flu. Common symptoms of the flu include high fever, severe headache, muscle and body aches, chills, sore throat, exhaustion and dry cough. Children may also have nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea. Symptoms often start abruptly. Often cold symptoms come on more gradually and they include stuffy nose, sneezing, sore throat and hacking cough.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the best way to prevent your child from getting the flu is to take him/her to get a flu vaccine. Washing hands frequently with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds is the second best way to prevent all spread of germs. If you haven't already - teach your student to sneeze/cough into the inside of the elbow or into a tissue, disposing of the tissue immediately, to avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth, and to not share food/beverage with others. Together we can keep kids healthy and learning!

### **Immunization Reminder:**


Immunization reporting in the health office is in full swing! If your student brings home or you receive a letter in the mail regarding immunizations, PLEASE return to school ASAP. One change this year is that the dose of Tdap typically required for entry to 6th, has been changed to 7th grade. That means that those 7th graders who signed a waiver for the Tdap vaccine last year will need to sign a new waiver this year. You will receive a letter if this is the case for your student.

Please join us for our October meeting on Wednesday the 11<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm to help us finalize plans for Fall Fest.


