

Public School Safety in Port Edwards and Across Wisconsin

Tragically, extreme violence has increased significantly in school systems across the United States over the past several years. The names of School Districts that were once known only locally (Sandy Hook, Columbine, and Uvalde, to name a few) have become known nationally due to acts of violence committed on their campuses. This school year, Apalachee High School in Winder, Georgia was the most recent campus that experienced the tragic effects of school violence.

It is an expectation from parents, staff and everyone living in our communities that our schools will be safe and welcoming environments for our children. In order to make our schools as safe as possible, the state of Wisconsin has significantly increased their efforts to keep our schools safe:

- The Wisconsin Department of Justice has a specific division, dedicated to teaching and implementing safety practices: *The Office of School Safety*. This department coordinates trainings, implements and teaches best practices for school safety, and coordinates threat assessments with both law enforcement and school districts.
- The Office of School Safety has also created a reporting tool available to members of the public 24 hours a day: the "Speak Up, Speak Out" hotline (1-800-697-8776). This phone number can be used by anyone who is made aware of a potential school threat; the Office will then work with our school district and local police to promptly assess and address the situation.
- Like all school districts in Wisconsin, the Port Edwards School District follows the safety
 guidelines that are found in Wisconsin state statute 118.07. This statute requires that
 schools conduct and report to their School Boards (on an annual basis) about school safety
 drills, consult with local law enforcement for safety assessments, and conduct school safety
 plan training.

The safety and well being of our students and staff is of critical importance to the Port Edwards School District. We are in contact with our local Police Department on a daily basis, assessing both school district campuses and surrounding areas to provide the safest environment possible. If you have any questions, thoughts or concerns about school safety, please contact myself or the Port Edwards Police Department.

Notes from the Nurse

I hope the transition back to school for your family has been a smooth one. For those of you who enjoy summer-like weather, it has been the perfect start to the school year for you!

One of the primary focus points during the month of October for school nurses is coordinating and running school based health screening services. These services are important for a variety of reasons:

- Screenings can identify concerns early, which may lead to faster care and improved treatment options
- Screenings can help to build awareness of the importance of health maintenance and resilience for those students who may struggle with medical appointments due to sensory issues or previous negative experiences
- School based screenings are cost effective aka FREE
- School based screenings are less time consuming and more trauma sensitive than intervening later
- School-based health screenings increase access to care for students from low-income/minoritized families

The PESD is proud to offer hearing, vision and dental screenings each year for our students. The schedule for screenings for the 2024/25 school year is below:

• 9/30-10/1 - Healthy Smiles - Slips must be returned in order to participate.

10/23 - Vision screening - Students in grades 4K, K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 10, and 12 are eligible. Permission slips will be sent home in early October. All eligible students will be screened unless the "opt-out" slip is returned.

10/28 Hearing screening - This is for students in kindergarten only. Permission slips will be sent home as the date gets closer. All students will be screened unless the "opt-out" slip is returned

As always, please let me know if there is anyway we can support your student's health!

School Immunization Reporting

The Wisconsin Department of Health and Human Services requires schools to maintain and report on student immunization compliance each year. Students who are found out of compliance on the 30th day of school are required to be excluded from school for 10 days starting on the 31st day (October 16) or until immunization compliance is achieved, whichever is sooner. Letters were sent home the middle of September and again at the end of the month. If you have questions about your students immunization compliance, you can contact the health office. Your primary care provider can also help.


Coalition Member Girl Scouts of the Northwestern Great Lakes Provides Opportunities for Growth

Per request, President Daven agreed to move agenda item #15

15. 4K Wrap-Around Daycare

Superintendent Bena presented information regarding opening a 4K Wrap-Around Daycare in the elementary building. Representatives from the YMCA, including Tim Birkhauser, YMCA Board Member, were in attendance and shared details on the position of the YMCA and what would be required in order for the YMCA to operate the daycare. It was stated that there would need to be approximately seven children in attendance at the daycare to break even. The YMCA stated that the daycare operations including licensing cannot operate at a loss. The Board and Superintendent Bena discussed options to assure that this would not happen and discussed possible ways to subsidize the program possibly using Fund 80. Location of the daycare in the elementary school was also discussed.

Motion by Hildebrandt, second by Daven to approve the YMCA to operate a Wrap-Around Daycare, provided licensing is granted and does not operate at a loss. Voting yes - all. Motion carried.

4. President's Report

A. Board Member Attendance

President Daven reported that all Board members were present.

B. Next Board Meeting

President Daven reported that the meeting of the Board of Education will be August 21, 2024.

5. Administrative Reports

A. District Administrator Report - Superintendent Bena

Superintendent Bena reported that the Wisconsin DPI has released its preliminary estimate for the state general school aid. This year the district will see an increase of \$523,922 or 14.28% over last year.

Mr. Bena reported that the three-week summer school program was complete and thanked the teachers and staff for their hard work. He also stated that the food service department reported an increase of 300 meals over last year's summer school.
