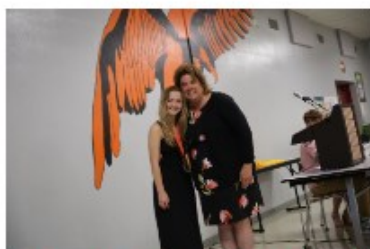

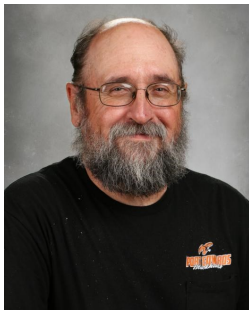

## **Port Edwards Finishes in 3rd Place in Central Wisconsin Math League Competition**

On Monday, April 29th, the Central Wisconsin Math League hosted its “Fifty-Fourth Year” Awards Banquet. It was on that night that the final results of the combined scores for the three meets were revealed. Port Edwards ended up in third place overall in the Division 4 category. Division 4 had the most teams competing with eighteen teams, Division 3 had eleven, Division 2 had nine, and Division 1 had seven teams.

For each meet, a team comprised of twelve John Edwards high school students competed in the three Central Wisconsin Math League contests held throughout the year hosted by UW-Stevens Point. Students competed locally by taking a test to see who would represent the team at each of the individual meets.

Senior Emmanuel Van Lysal finished 3rd overall in the Advanced Math category for Division 4 and Junior Brynden Beck finished in 9th place. Sophomore Joey Doebereiner finished in 10th place in the Algebra category as did Freshman Giffiin Tranel in the Geometry category.

Other students competing for John Edwards High School in the Geometry category were Junior Aliya McKenzie, Sophomores Ethan Boerner, Tony DeMarco, Rylee Duckart, Price Hanson and Austin Irwin, and Freshman Khayla Peckham; in the Algebra II category were Juniors Olivia Allworden, Noah Haltner, Makayla McGuffey and Nevada Rice and Sophomores Jasper Detlefsen and Breanna Ingram; and in the Advanced Math category were Senior Dakota Bares and Juniors Felicity Clouse and Rayna Dassow. The advisors for the team were Mrs. Tami Griffith and Mrs. Deb Martin.

Congratulations to these students and great job on a fine finish. We’re looking forward to more top three finishes in the future!



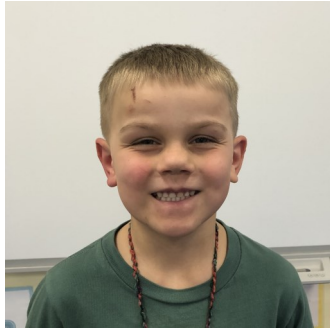

- Auth Consulting (ACA) was low bidder and awarded the Engineering contract. That contract has been issued.
- Tech Ed Abatement winning low bidder was Brack Thermal
- Tech Ed Epoxy flooring winning low bidder was Pro-Maintenance
  - Both contracts have been issued and work is expected to be completed 8/12.
- Bids for masonry are in process.
- The maintenance of the electrical system at the Port Edwards Elementary School has been awarded to a local electrical contractor: E-con Electric.

### CONSTRUCTION UPDATES



- The exterior of the Port Edwards Middle/High School has a great deal of caulk that will be replaced. The caulk was tested for asbestos content and those areas are now identified for abatement.
- The exterior of the Port Edwards Middle/High School has many steel lintels that need to be refinished to make them last longer. The existing paint on those lintels was tested for lead content. Those lintels with lead content above the legal threshold have been identified and a painting company that specializes in lead abatement is providing a quote for refinishing.



A construction update will be provided monthly by CESA 10 to communicate the project budget, recent work, and upcoming deliverables.
