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

Building for the Present, While Maintaining and Honoring our History

One of the most impressive features of the Port Edwards School District when guests visit is the architectural beauty of John Edwards High School. Built in 1932, the building's appearance and original character have been maintained, as its classrooms have been updated on a routine basis to stay current with modern teaching practices. Over the last several years, the Dorothy Alexander Auditorium, building entry ways, and central office area have all received physical updates that have made these spaces more practical, safe, and welcoming.

The most recent physical upgrade to John Edwards High School is the complete renovation of the chemistry lab. Until the renovation, the labs

walls, sinks, countertops, and many other features dated back to the early 1950's, and had outlived their useful lives. Throughout the summer of 2022, various companies worked on a scheduled basis to replace the plaster walls, outdated ceiling and worn out floor, electrical, and plumbing components. The Port Edwards School District worked with a master contractor from CESA 10 to help contract and schedule the various companies that performed the work. The chemistry lab project wasn't free from the problems that other projects nationwide are facing, however, difficulties in securing materials, as well as labor, at times, delayed the anticipated completion date. After several months, during the week of October 10th, the final work was completed in the lab, and our custodians and Chemistry Teacher, Mrs. Griffith were able to begin moving her materials back into the new classroom with plenty of time to spare before her first labs are taught during trimester number two.

John Edwards High School continues to be an example of the character of our village: welcoming and timeless. With the support of our community, it is a goal of our district to continue to keep JEHS a building that will allow our students to maximize their learning potential, by maintaining it for years to come.

It is important to note that we have developed a Google calendar for all district events. It can be found on the home page, 5th tab to the right, called activities. This calendar will provide concerts, parent-teacher conferences, drama performances and more. It will be a great resource that will provide family updates regularly. We

hope this will keep a current connection with the community and share the wonderful events happening in our schools.

The night of October 20th the building was bustling with parents. Parent-teacher conferences have been held for teachers to share student progress since the 1930s. There are so many benefits to parents and teachers meeting. One of the major benefits include the sharing of information, by both parents and teachers, to further the child's academic and social development. This meeting should also establish good relationships between home and school. Teachers can clarify the meaning of grades, explain curriculum and clear up possible misunderstandings. While we will offer a night of conferences each trimester, please feel free to call or email your child's teacher(s) at any time if you have questions or concerns, or to share a positive with the teacher. We love to celebrate those with families!

Finally, I would like to continue providing information on attendance and explain what constitutes a student being considered truant. Being absent can lead to doing poorly in school. Students who miss many days of school are more likely to fail their classes, drop out of high school, and/or have poor relationships with parents and teachers. A student is considered habitually truant when they are absent without an acceptable excuse all or *part of ten or more days* in a school year. The Middle/High School will be sending a letter to notify families when their child is absent for 5 days and then 10 days. After 10 days are recorded, parents will be invited to a meeting to problem solve attendance barriers with our staff which could include the principal, counselor, nurse and SRO officer. The meeting is to make a plan to improve the students attendance and avoid legal tickets and Wood County truancy referrals.

Notes from the Nurse

I hope your family has been enjoying the start of the fall season. The holiday season and colder weather are right around the corner. This is a time when we tend to get out of our typical eating routines and let those healthy choices slide. We know that good nutrition is vital to student success at school. Flavonoids are a group of natural substances found in certain foods. When flavonoids are consumed, they activate an enzyme that stimulates the flow of oxygen and blood to the brain, improving focus and working memory, which can in turn help improve students performance at school. Flavonoids are found in fruits, vegetables and whole grains. Below are a few easy suggestions for incorporating flavonoids into your and your child's diet.

Sugar swaps: Cutting 1 or 2 sugary foods in your child's diet and replacing them with a fruit or a whole grain can make a huge difference. Consider replacing cookies with whole grain fig/fruit bars.

Cereal swap: Look out for cereal that contains whole grains. It is indicated on the front of the box. You can then add chopped bananas or berries to sweeten it!

After school snack swaps: Try snacks with no added sweeteners like plain rice cakes or popcorn, veggie sticks and hummus. Add peanut butter or yogurt based dip for more flavor! Please contact the health offices at any time if we can assist your student or family! at any time if there are concerns you have for your child that we may be able to assist with.

Winter Clothing Reminder!

The weather is turning colder by the say—BUT—your students are still heading outside each and every day for recess! Here are some tips for keeping your student comfortable, warm and safe as the temperatures drop:

- Dress your child in layers
- Send an extra sweatshirt or jacket for them to keep at school when the temperatures are fluctuating frequently.
- Send gloves and hats everyday (as well as snow pants and boots once the snow flies)
- Put an extra pair of socks in backpacks in case they get wet or cold feet.





District Administrator Report – Superintendent Bena

Superintendent Bena reported that the first day of school, September 1st, was successful and a great start. This past week was one of the most challenging times our school district and community has experienced with the tragic passing of one of our JEHS students. Superintendent Bena publicly thanked our staff, volunteers, and community for the support that was given. The school districts

of Nekoosa and Wisconsin Rapids immediately reached out offering their counseling services to us and other districts from the central Wisconsin conference also reached out offering support. Mr. Bena thanked the following

individuals for offering their professional services to the district on September 6. Rauni Vruwink, Sam Casev, Jeff & Carev O'Connor. Tanya Callahan, Chris Hanten and Paul Liebherr. Superintendent Bena also thanked the administration team and commended Jennifer Moore and Heather Lisitza.

Superintendent Bena stated that the new website is up and running and that we continue to make updates.

Governor Evers has announced that schools will receive funds from the Federal American Rescue Act to address mental health and to attract and obtain quality teachers. The district will receive \$41,000 for academic resources and \$15,000 for mental health services. This funding will be received later this fall.

Superintendent Bena stated he will be serving on the Rural & Small Schools State Committee for the 2022-23 school year

Elementary Principal Report – Principal Christy

The district will also will be starting the GEDO-2 for those struggling to graduate with a regular diploma. Principal Shroda stated that this is fiscally responsible for the district. Mrs. McMillen, At-Risk instructor, will be running the program. Students will attend 15 hours a week, will have required community service hours as well as work hours. This program is for credit-deficient juniors.
